"If you don't see something, say something!" (hahaha, get it??)




If you do not want a plant or a hedge trimmed, please see Summer. She will give you a red reflector to put in front of it.


US-1 Just North of Northlake Blvd.

Recipe of the Month

Tzatzíkí Sauce

I absolutely love this recipe! I found this on a great website you might be familiar with, <u>The Mediterranean Dish.</u> If not, I suggest you check them out – great, healthy recipes!

Ingredients:

- 3/4 English cucumber (sometimes called a seedless cucumber), partially peeled (in other words, peel vertically, leaving some 'stripes' of the peel); then slice
- 1 tsp kosher salt, divided
- 4-5 garlic cloves, peeled, and finely grated or minced (I personally use 3 garlic cloves and its plenty)
- 1 tsp white vinegar
- 1 tbsp Extra Virgin Olive Oil
- 2 cups Greek yogurt (I use organic, fat free, but you can use any kind)
- 1/4 tsp ground white pepper
- · Warm pita bread and some sliced vegetables for serving

Directions:

- In a food processor, grate the cucumber slices. Toss with ½ tsp of the kosher salt. Transfer to a fine mesh strainer over a deep bowl to drain.
- Spoon the grated cucumber into a cheese cloth or a double-thick napkin and squeeze dry. Set aside briefly.
- In a large mixing bowl, add the garlic, the remaining ½ tsp salt, white vinegar, and the extra virgin olive oil mix to combine.
- Add the grated cucumber to the large bowl with the garlic mixture. Stir in the yogurt and white pepper. Combine thoroughly. Cover tightly and refrigerate for a couple of hours.
- When ready to serve, stir the tzatziki sauce to refresh it and transfer to a serving bowl drizzle a little more extra virgin olive oil. Enjoy with some warmed pita bread and/or your favorite veggies!

First Impressions – Entry Spaces

Ideal Entry

Take a moment to envision what your ideal entry would look like - an entry that looks good, feels good, and might even boost your mood when you walk in the door. Once you've done the first step, now you are ready to find "homes" for the items you use the most: bags, shoes, jackets, dog leashes, keys, sunglasses, etc. Take a moment to jot down an inventory of the items that frequently come and go in your home.

- Mail
- Coats
- Umbrellas
- Bags & Backpacks
- Reusable Shopping Bags
- Shoes
- Sunglasses
- Keys
- Hats
- Hand Sanitizer & Masks
- Scarves
- Dog Leashes
- Baby Gear

A Place for Everything and Everything in its Place

Now that you have your list, you will want to create a clear "home" for each item in your entry. You will want to store daily-use items in easy-to-access areas.



Here are some great ideas for creating a functional entry space:

- Shoe Storage Ikea has great storage options, but you could also use a basket or place shoes under a bench. The key is to limit the number of shoes in your entry way. If you live in a cold or wet climate, add a boot tray for wet, muddy shoes.
- Hooks Use hooks for bags, backpacks, coats, hats, keys and even dog leashes.
- Tray or Bowl Use a woven tray or wooden bowl as a catchall for wallets, sunglasses, or keys.
- Labeled Bins or Baskets I have two baskets, one for outgoing items and one for items that need to be brought upstairs.
- Inbox Use a tray, bin, or wall-mounted pocket to collect mail, action items, and school forms.
- Bench Having a spot to put on and take off shoes will help keep your house tidy. Choose an option that can store shoes underneath for double-duty functionality.
- Umbrella Stand I found an attractive container to store umbrellas.





Elements for a Stylish Entry

Rug – Consider adding a simple, stylish doormat to help keep your floors clean. You can choose a beautiful dhurrie rug or a more durable water hog but remember that it is one of the first things people see when they come inside.

Lighting – Add a table lamp or pendant with a lower wattage bulb for a cozy, inviting vibe.

Personality – Add photos or fun art that showcase your style.

Mirror – A mirror will reflect light and gives you the opportunity for a quick check before heading out the door.

Plant/Flowers – Adding a natural element freshens up your space.

Once you have your entry set up, you will want to maintain the space with these simple tips:

- Put mail, bills, and action items in your inbox immediately.
- Put away extra shoes daily.
- Hang hats, bags, and coats as soon as you walk inside.
- Rotate out seasonal items.

What to Watch/Stream

The Crime/Mystery Edition – Across The Pond!!

The Gentlemen is an English crime drama series airing on Netflix. This witty, action crime series is created by Guy Ritchie, and is based on his 2019 movie of the same name. The series (8 episodes) began airing on Netlfix in March and it's terrific! The story centers on Edward Horniman, who unexpectedly inherited an estate and the title of Duke of Halstead at the reading of the last will and testament of his deceased father. He quickly learns that the land has become part of a marijuana-growing empire run by Susie Glass. He must navigate the world of these nefarious, dangerous characters and their equally evil agendas, while trying to protect his home and stay alive.

Broadchurch is not new, but so engrossing, that it's worth reminding folks it's still out there to watch! This British crime mystery begins when the corpse of an 11-year old British boy (Danny Latimer), is found bloodied and dirty on a beach, in the small community of Broadchurch, in Dorset. The town becomes the focus of a police investigation and media mayhem, Out-of-town Detective, Inspector Alec Hardy gets the lead position over Detective Sgt. Ellie Miller, who feels the job should have been hers. Now she must make this working relationship with Hardy a success. Slowly, more members of the community of Broadchurch are drawn into the investigation, with one character bringing attention to himself because of a special connection to the case. And, while all this is going on, Danny's family tries to cope with their grief as they navigate the media attention, a named suspect and a subsequent trial. The series is 3 seasons long, and you can find it on Amazon Prime and Apple TV+.

Luthur is a British psychological crime thriller series starring **Idris Elba** (need I say more???!) as DCI John Luthur. The story of Detective Luthur is actually broken down into different 'sub series' (5 in all), which first aired in 2010, and concluded in 2019. In the first series, Detectie Luthur works for the Serious Crime Unit – he is dedicated, obsessive, possessed and sometimes violent. While the job always comes first, he has never been able to prevent himself from being consumed by the darkness of the crimes he deals with – truly a heavy price to pay for dedication!!



Keep the Dunes Beautiful


There is no Maid service at the pool!

Please clean up after yourself. All litter should be placed in the trash cans. Umbrellas should be closed when you leave to prevent damage to them. Please rinse off any sand before entering either the pool or the spa. Sand damages the filters. If you turn the fans or the TV on please shut them off when you leave. If no one is at the pool when you are leaving and you see them on, please turn them off.

A Reminder:

Please hold the pool gate until it is shut.

Please do not let the pool gates slam. Aside from being annoying, it will damage the gate.



Please pick up after your pet

So you walk your dog and he/she poops. You pick it up in a poop bag, tie it in a neat knot, and place it on top of the bag dispenser and you think your job is done.

Reminders to all Residents

ALL changes to the exterior of your home require Board approval. An Architectural Change form must be submitted to Summer **before** doing any work. This form may be downloaded from the Villas of Ocean Dunes website.

Dumpsters

Contractors are to haul away any debris they create. Please tell them that they are not to use the garbage bins!

Bags with cans and bottles must never be placed in the recycle bins. Empty the bags!

Cardboard boxes must be collapsed. If they are too large they should be placed in the large dumpster.

Parking

Parking is a huge issue in the community. Please use your assigned spots. Guest spots are not for the use of owners on a constant basis. There is overflow parking at the tennis court or at the pool.

No street parking is allowed. Emergency vehicles, waste management trucks and your neighbors need to be able to pass. Do not leave your car in the street overnight!

Tennis Courts

No pets, roller skaters, baby carriages or bicycles are allowed on the tennis courts at any time. They damage the court surface.
